Silvassa District Panchayat: IEC conducted through various channels, strict ban is observed on SUP & SWM Bye-Laws, 2021 implemented.
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IX. Details of Alternate Treatment Technology being adopted by the State/UT :

- Daman Municipal Council: No
- Daman District Panchayat: At present plastics are separated through trommel screen and manual labour.
- Silvassa Municipal Council: No
- Silvassa District Panchayat:

1. Twin Pit Toilets are installed.
2. Use of cloth bags is encouraged.
3. Strict surveillance is conducted by Field Supervisors on banned products.

- Diu Municipal Council: There are 2 nos. of 2 Vacuum machines vehicles for cleaning sewers, domestic septic tanks, open drains etc. in Diu Municipal Area.

Details of equipment: -Vacuum Tractor (Capacity 10,000 Lit)

-Vacuum Rickshaw (Capacity 5,000 Lit)

- Diu District Panchayat: 4 Nos. of Septic tank emptier vehicles in Diu District i.e., Vanakbara, Saudwadi, Bucharwada and Zolawadi Panchayat to clean and collect the sewage from septic tank of individual households and transport it to trenching method.

- Phyto-remediation and Bioremediation proposal for the identified drain has been received from NEERI and the same is approved. After issuing the work order, NEERI has carried out pre-feasibility survey of the proposed drains (03 Nos.) for installation of In-Situ treatment in Daman.

- In DNH, 7545 number of households have been connected to the sewerage network.

X. Identification of polluting sources including drains contributing to river pollution and action as per NGT order on in-situ treatment:

Polluting sources are identified. 13 nallahs / drains have been identified for Phytoremediation and Bioremediation measures. The work is being initiated for in-situ treatment of the drain near Rajiv Gandhi Setu, Daman. Pre-feasibility survey has been carried by the officials of the NEERI.

XI. Details of Nodal Officer appointed by Chief Secretary in the State/UT:

Secretary, Urban Development for municipal area and Secretary, Rural Development for rural areas are the Nodal Authority for compliance in the UT of Dadra Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu.

XII. Details of meetings carried under the Chairmanship Chief of Secretary in the State/UT:

The Advisor to the Administrator held meeting on regular basis with Urban Development, Rural Development and Pollution Control Committee and asked to comply with the directions related to Solid Waste Management, Sewage Management, Plastic Waste Management, Bio-medical Waste Management and Hazardous Waste Management.

XIII. Latest water quality of polluted river, its tributaries, drains with flow details of polluted river:

Work order to carry River water monitoring (14 locations) programme in the U. T. of DNH & DD has been allotted to outsource Laboratory (NABL, MoEF approved) vide order No. PCC/DMN/Project/R-G/2018-19/214, dated: 27/12/2023, and River Monitoring of the said 14 stations planed fourth week of January 2024.

XIV. Ground water regulation:

- Silvassa District Panchayat: Roof top recharging system installed in all Govt. building 20 Gram Panchayats of DNH district.
- Additional location for recharge of ground water is being identified in each Gram Panchayats and each Gram Panchayats have taken the Rain water Harvesting / Recharge work under their respective Active Plan.
- Daman District Panchayat: Recharging of Government wells and checking misuse.
- Diu District Panchayat: Wells have been successfully recharged through rooftop recharging system in 4 Gram Panchayats of Diu district. Additional location for recharge of ground water is being identified in each Gram Panchayats and each Gram Panchayats have taken the Rain Water Harvesting / Recharge work under their respective Action Plan.
- **In industrial area, all the industries were directed to obtain No Objection Certificate (NOC) from Central Ground Water Authority (CGWA).**

XV. Good irrigation practices being adopted by the State:

- Farm ponds have been created for ground water rejuvenation. Terrace cultivation is being practiced in the undulating terrains of DNH.
- Farm ponds have been maintained to check and reduce runoff.
- Training programs carried out for awareness on micro irrigation projects for Farmers.
- Deepening of ponds have been carried out to improve irrigation, ground water and to conserve rain water.

XVI. Rain Water Harvesting:

- 07 Conventional RWH structures were built under Adarsh Gram Panchayat by PWD, District Panchayat, Daman.
- 67 Nos. of rooftop rain water harvesting structures have been installed to recharge bore wells and 33 Nos. of open wells in 14 Panchayats of Daman district.
- 02 Ponds have been successfully recharged.
- All new industrial units and construction projects shall provide suitable rainwater harvesting system to reduce dependency over ground water resource or to recharge the ground water table.
- Check dams and percolation tanks have been constructed to reduce runoff and improve the ground water recharge and erosion.
- **District Panchayat, Diu:** Gram Panchayats have undertaken the Rain Water Harvesting / Recharge work under their respective Action Plan. All the government premises located in Panchayat areas are being implemented RWH systems in their premises.
- **Diu Municipal Council:** As per Building bye-laws of Diu Municipal Council it is mandatory to provide the Rain Water Harvesting system for all new buildings with plot area more than 200 sq. mtrs for all uses.

- **Daman Municipal Council:** It is mandatory for any building or houses to install water harvesting system to enrich the ground water. All the building under the control of DMC is fitted with water harvesting system.
- **Silvassa Municipal Council:** Silvassa Municipal Council has completed the work of providing Rain Water Harvesting system in all the SMC related building such as Primary Schools, Community Centers, etc. As per development Control Rule, D&NH, 2014. It is mandatory for any applicant seeking Occupancy Certificate to install Rain Water Harvesting system in the property.

XVII. Demarcation of Floodplain and removal of illegal encroachments:

- The illegal encroachments along the drains / nallahs have been removed by the District Administration.
- Regular inspections by Municipal Council / District Panchayat are being carried out to check the free flow of water & ensure no obstacles.

XVIII. Maintaining minimum e-flow of river:

Minimum environmental flow for the river is maintained at various locations. Developed the Riverfront area along Damanganga river stretch in Silvassa.

XIX. Plantation activities along the rivers:

- Tree plantations were carried out in 300 Ha. of area in Dadra & Nagar Haveli along the nallahs and inlets in upstream area and along the river.
- Plantation near the check dams have been carried out in Dadra Nagar Haveli. Necessary initiatives are being taken by the local bodies and forest department to increase the plantation on both the sides of the river by creating awareness programs. Regular plantation have been carried out at various locations in Dadra Nagar Haveli.
- Bamboo plantation have been carried out in 25 Km area in Dadra Nagar Haveli.
- Roadside plantation, community places & Amrit Sarovars.

- Mangrove plantation in 60 Ha. Has been taken up in Diu and Daman districts. The marshy areas near Damanganga River near Moti Daman have been planted with Mangroves.

XX. Development of biodiversity park:

Following bio-diversity parks had been setup in the Damanganga River catchment area:

1. Nakshatra Van.
2. City Park.
3. Butterfly Garden
4. Precedent Garden

XXI. Reuse of Treated Water:

- **Daman Municipal Council:** Treated water is used for watering the football ground, filling the moat, and watering the plant and trees in the periphery of the fort, Moti Daman.
- **Diu Municipal Council:** The work of contraction of STP is under Progress, hence, not applicable.
- **Silvassa Municipal Council:** Used for the purpose of gardening and plantation, flushing of Storm water drains along the road side, filled soil compaction and flow test for the Sewerage network.
- **Silvassa District Panchayat:** As there is No STP in any rural areas of Dadra & Nagar Haveli. Thus, the information with respect to District Panchayat, DNH may be treated as NIL.
- Treated water from STP is being reused daily for works such as road washing, horticulture, soil compaction, irrigation etc.
- Operators of the STPs at Daman and Silvassa started use of mobile based application developed by CPCB and regularly update the status of the STP.

XXII. Model River being adopted by the State & Action Proposed for achieving the bathing quality standards:

There is only one river Damanganga in the U.T. of Dadra Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu, which is under Priority III as per the State-wise & Priority wise number of Polluted

River Stretches as identified in 2022 by CPCB. Actions are already proposed and steps towards achieving bathing quality are taken.

- Polluted river stretches are divided in five priority categories i.e. I, II, III, IV, V depending upon the BOD level:
 - i. Criteria for Priority I: BOD concentration 30 mg/l or more.
 - ii. Criteria for Priority II: BOD between 20 – 30 mg/l
 - iii. Criteria for Priority III: BOD between 10-20 mg/l
 - iv. Criteria for Priority IV: BOD between 6-10 mg/l
 - v. Criteria for Priority V: BOD between 3-6 mg/l
- Now, the quality of the river is improved and all the monitoring locations have BOD - 3 mg/l or less.
- River Monitoring of the 14 stations planed fourth week of January 2024.

XXIII. Status of Preparation of Action Plan by the 13 Coastal States:

- Integrated Coastal Zone Management plan for Daman & Diu is proposed under ENCORE project funded by World Bank and MoEF & CC.
- The Ghoghla beach in Diu is among the 8 beaches in the country awarded with Blue Flag Certification.
- India has also bagged 3rd prize under the International Best Practices in pollution abatement in coastal regions.
- The National Centre for Sustainable Coastal Management, Chennai has been requested for preparation of action plan for Management of Coastal areas of Daman and Diu as per directions of CPCB.
- National Institute of Oceanography (NIO), Mumbai has carried out monitoring of Jampore and Devka beach in UT of Daman in 2018. As per the report, it is concluded that there is no evidence for significant deterioration of environmental quality of the beaches investigated except for high Faecal Coliform counts which is common in coastal waters of India.

- **There was an issue with the notification from Daman & Diu coastal management Authority which has been done in December 2023 from the Ministry of Environment Forest & Climate Change (MoEF & CC) subsequently, the 2019 notification map will be finalized and thereafter, implementation of Integrated Coastal Management Plan will follow. Public hearing for the same is under process.**

XXIV. Regulation of Mining Activities in the State/UT:

There is no mining activity carried out in the U.T. of Dadra Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu.

XXV. Action against identified polluters, law violators and officers responsible for failure for vigorous monitoring.

- **Daman Municipal Council:** Regular monitoring and inspections are being carried out to identify the polluters and any law violators in the U. T. For violations, appropriate directions / notices are being issued as laid down in the Daman Municipal Council Solid Waste (Handling and Management) Bye-laws 2018.
- **Daman District Panchayat:** Under Plastic Waste Management (for violation of plastic waste orders) and SWM Bye Laws (for littering, pen fires etc.) fines are being imposed to violators.
- **Silvassa Municipal Council:** Ward wise Supervisors, Monitors and Swachhata Praharis are assigned to monitor the violations under the Bye-Laws (Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu Silvassa Municipal Council Solid Waste (Handling and Management) (Amendment) Bye-Laws, 2020) and enforce the fines against the violators, and Plastic Waste Management Cell is also formed in Silvassa Municipal Council.
- **Silvassa District Panchayat:** Regular monitoring and inspections are being carried out to identify the polluters and any law violators in the U. T. For violations, appropriate directions / notices are being issued with environmental compensation based on polluter pay principle.

- **Diu Municipal Council:** Regular monitoring and inspections are being carried out to identify the polluters and any law violators in the U. T. For violations, appropriate directions / notices are being issued with environmental compensation based on polluter pay principle.

- **Diu District Panchayat:** Regular monitoring and inspections are being carried out to identify the polluters and any law violators in the U. T. For violations, appropriate directions / notices are being issued with environmental compensation based on polluter pay principle.
